Warm greetings from Burkina. We have enjoyed a blessed and hot summer. By God's grace things are going well. Our students started school last month. They all are doing good and excited for this new year and very excited about what they are going to learn. We have 21 girls this year. 15 of them had the chance to attend a camp last June with a mission team from California. The team shared about "God's treasured girls." This was a blessed time for the girls and they have kept good souvenirs. The USA team brightened the kids' lives by demonstrating to the girls the unconditional love of Christ and their own value. Some of the girls were living with a failure mentality because they didn't do very well in school, but the Lord used the team members to show the girls that there is a purpose for their lives and to encourage them to seek God's plan for their lives.

During July, August, and September, the students were at their villages for a 3 month holiday. They spent time with their relatives and were able to participate in farming activities and church activities. They were proud to share with their brothers and sisters Bible principles.

Aminata Wangrawa is from an animist religion, which means the family is worshiping idols. Her dad is married to several women. Aminata made the decision to give her life to Jesus in 2009 when she was going through family problems. She had a broken heart and frustrations and she found peace in the Lord. Last year her dad told her that he has been humiliated with her decision to be a Christian and started to plan a way to get her married. At that time she was not going to school and had to work hard cultivating the ground and going to the bush to get wood for the fire to cook food and get water from the river. When we heard her story we prayed and a friend of ours from a village nearby went and asked permission from her father to have her in the Village of Opportunity sewing program. After a few days he allowed her to come. She is living her faith and she is so happy to be able to worship the Lord and be with the other girls at the CWO school. One of her friends at the school gave her life to JESUS two days ago and Aminata is happy about that. Last week her dad called her and told that he is proud of her and that he is no longer angry about her decision to be Christian. Praise the Lord.

The CWO library is working good. It is open 6 days a week and has several activities to improve the reading level of the youngest. Mrs. Ilboudo Rakieta is the one taking care of that program. She has a new baby girl of 3 months .
